INTRODUCTION

On the occasion of the first birth centenary of Quaid-i-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah in 1976, the Quaid-i-Azam Academy was established by a Resolution of the Government of Pakistan, as an autonomous body. It was set up to promote the study of, and research into, the life and work of Quaid-i-Azam and his close associates, the Pakistan Movement and the various aspects of Pakistan. Research, writing and publication, in terms of this reference, are accordingly by the prime functions of the Quaid-i-Azam Academy. The Academy is headed by a Chairman and works as a component organization of Ministry of Culture and Sports, Government of Pakistan. The President of Pakistan is the Patron and the Prime Minister of Pakistan is the President, while the Federal Minister for Culture is the Vice President and the Federal Secretary for Culture is the Executive Head of the Academy.

The Academy has a Board of Governors and an Executive Committee empowered to make decisions for its smooth functioning. It has a full-time Director who functions as Administrative Head of the Academy.

MAIN FUNCTIONS

The objectives of the Academy are to sponsor and promote all such activities as would promote the study of the life and work of Quaid-i-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, his close associates, the Pakistan Movement, and the various aspects of Pakistan, such as:

- To undertake, organize and promote research on Quaid-i-Azam, on the genesis, evolution and culmination of the Pakistan Movement, encompassing its cultural, religious, literary, social, economic and political aspects, and on the various aspects of Pakistan itself;
- To establish an extended research library, acquire research material and documents including copies of collections of the Department of National Archives, Islamabad, and other private collections;
- To hold and sponsor lectures, talks, seminars, meetings, study groups and activities organized by other bodies.

In furtherance of the above objectives, the Academy has to institute scholarships and professorships, publish journals, and award prizes for writings contributed by scholars.

ACHIEVEMENTS & PROGRESS

The research staff of the Academy were assigned to get three monographs written on the Quaid's associates. Of these, the monograph on Raja Sahib of Mahmoodabad (in Urdu) has been printed. The remaining two, on Sir Ghulam Hussain Hidayatullah and Qazi Mohammad Isa, were rewritten and are under review.

The Academy has managed publication of the following books by scholars of repute in different languages, viz. English, Urdu, Sindhi, Baluchi Pashto and Punjabi:

The publication of Jinnah Papers has been organized into different series, each series containing a number of volumes. The first series covers the period from 20-2-1947 to 30-9-1948. The second series covers the period from 1-10-1943 to 19-2-1947. The third series has been started from January 1940.

The period covered by various volumes in each series has been determined with reference to important events in Jinnah's personal life and the political processes he was caught up in. In general terms, the scheme of publication follows a chronological pattern for each of its series.

Because of the significance of the events immediately leading up to the partition of India, it was decided to publish the volumes in reverse order. The period 20-2-1947 to 2-6-1947 represented the fruition of Jinnah's struggle to secure Pakistan, hence it was made the starting point for publication of *Jinnah Papers*.

Volume XIII is ready and expected to be printed in the near future while work is in progress on Volumes XIV and XV.

Urdu Version

Five volumes of Urdu version of *Jinnah Papers* have been published and the sixth volume is likely to go to the printing press shortly.

Books

A book on Quaid-i-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, in PERSIAN titled 'Nabgha-i-Asr' prepared in collaboration with Iranian Embassy, Islamabad, is in its final stages.

Another book on Quaid-i-Azam in ITALIAN, the material for which has been provided to the author, is nearly ready for printing.

The Editor-in-Chief, Dr. Z.H. Zaidi, is considering to get a book on Quaid-i-Azam written in ARABIC as well. Some scholars are being approached for the purpose.

Dissemination of Jinnah Papers

In order to disseminate information and promote research, *Jinnah Papers* have been marketed for sale through the Oxford University Press, Pakistan, besides providing some Volumes to a few luminaries. Whereas Urdu Volumes have been distributed to Government Universities and Colleges.
